Craters & Yale Subarea	
<b>Cities or Towns</b>	None. Sparsely populated in extreme south near Minidoka (Minidoka County).
<b>Public Lands</b>	53% managed by BLM and 39% National Park Service. 2% State owned and 1% Bureau of Reclamation. Approximately 2,000 acres (less than 1%) National Wildlife Refuge. 5% private land.
<b>Geography</b>	Primarily flood basalt areas with three major lava fields and open rift cracks. Lake Walcott and some farmland in extreme south.

<b>Activities Overview</b>	Hiking and bird watching at Craters of the Moon; fishing, birding and waterfowl hunting at Lake Walcott .
<b>Primary Recreation Sites &amp; Facilities</b>	Craters of the Moon National Monument and Preserve (main entrance and interpretive center is in Butte County); Minidoka National Wildlife Refuge (primary access is from Minidoka and Cassia Counties).
<b>Rivers, Streams, and Lakes</b>	Lake Walcott
