





Craters & Yale Subarea

Cities or Towns	None. Sparsely populated in extreme south near Minidoka (Minidoka County).
Public Lands	53% managed by BLM and 39% National Park Service. 2% State owned and 1% Bureau of Reclamation. Approximately 2,000 acres (less than 1%) National Wildlife Refuge. 5% private land.
Geography	Primarily flood basalt areas with three major lava fields and open rift cracks. Lake Walcott and some farmland in extreme south.






Natural Environment

Habitat	Extensive sage grouse habitat along with unique habitat of basalt region. Riparian and wetland areas adjacent to Lake Walcott provide excellent habitat at Minidoka National Wildlife Refuge.
Water	Dam below Lake Walcott provides power to surrounding agricultural area.
Subbasin	Lake Walcott and American Falls
Resource Use	Open space and recreation. Some agriculture in extreme south.
