Hi Heather,

We really appreciated the signs you put up for the recent three day equestrian/art event, especially about respect for the neighbors. However, they were of such lightweight material that they blew down quite early and were never put up again.

I'd like to suggest that the speed limit sign and the warning sign for the hard corner turn be made of sturdier material (wood or metal) that cannot be blown down easily and that the warning of "25 mph" be in letters not smaller than 8 -12". Also it would help if a similar speed limit sign was placed along Lower Broadford somewhere between Ottley's trailer and the turnoff to Townsend Gulch Road for those leaving the event. Perhaps the Marshall's office will have other suggestions.

I was working out near the street this morning and about 1 out of 3 cars was going too fast.

It may take awhile to work this out, but we know you're trying. We enjoyed the art show and it looks like you had a successful event. Thanks for your efforts.
